

ABOUT THE PLAY

The inspiration for *Godspell* arose on a snowy spring Easter Sunday during sunrise service when John-Michael Tebelak, a long-haired student at Carnegie-Mellon, was stopped and frisked for drugs by a Pittsburgh policeman in the nave of St. Paul's Cathedral. The young man came away from his experience amused but reflective—wondering, in a word, whether a certain long-haired Carpenter would have approved of people being falsely accused in His Father's house on the feast of His Resurrection merely because someone disliked or mistrusted their physical appearance.

As a candidate for the Master of Fine Arts Degree, Tebelak was required to direct a production of a classic or period piece as his "thesis." He requested and received permission to write his own play for this exercise and, using his Easter Sunday experience, he collaborated with young composer Stephen Schwartz to produce an original musical based

on the Gospel according to St. Matthew.

Using clown-children as his characters, Tebelak staged the Gospel using pantomime, funny voices, stage music, vaudeville song and dance, and a host of other devices. The result, far from being irreverent, was an exuberant celebration of the childlike joy of the Gospel; and because the audience could not easily remain uninvolved at the emotional level, the symbolic crucifixion and resurrection seemed to touch them in a way that most sermons could never-achieve.

When the show was staged, it immediately received enthusiastic acclaim; and for ten years since, it has continued to steal the hearts of clergymen, critics, and especially audiences throughout the United States and around the world. This unique musical, with its refreshing look at a 2000-year old book, has survived off-Broadway, Broadway, motion picture, foreign-language versions, and countless professional and amateur versions—and yet it retains its vitality, and the enthusiasm which it generates shows no sign of stopping. Go. pell's continued success is a tribute to the power of Jesus'"Good News," as well as to the concity of the human heart to respond to the warmth, joy, and love which are at the heart of the Gospel's message when it is brought to life. Long live Godspell!
